The Course

The diverse and fascinating world of the animal industry is growing all the time, making it an increasingly exciting industry to work in. Through examinations, written work, and practical assessments, this course will allow you to develop the skills and knowledge needed to progress into employment or further education in either Animal or Equine. You will develop practical experience in our industry standard equine yard and animal unit. You will study a range of animal and equine related subjects to develop a strong foundation of understanding to move onto level 2 if desired.

What You Will Study

- > Maintain the health of horses
- > Assist with the preparation for the exercise and after care of horses
- > Assist with the exercise of animals
- > Assist with the feeding and watering of Animals
- > Assist with the movement, handling and accommodation of animals
- > Assist with the handling and restraint of animals

Entry Requirements

You will need three GCSEs at grade 2 or equivalent, including English and Maths. One satisfactory reference and a passion for the subject.

Time Required on Campus

You will normally be in college three days a week.
